FOUNDERS VIEW

Well this is something I think everyone should know. Three years after the Germans capitulated, the Americans started bombing Berlin again. This was not because of anything the Germans had done. But rather what the Russians were doing. The Russians had decided they no longer wanted to share Berlin with anybody else. So they banned all shipments across Russian occupied Germany to Berlin by the Americans, British, and French occupiers. Hoping they would give up and leave. They didn't.

So they started flying in the needed supplies. The only way to get supplies was to fly it in. So began "Operation Vittles ", the delivery of basic food and fuels. Lieut. Gail Halvorsen flew into Tempelhof Central Airport in Berlin to see what was happening. While viewing the field he saw a group of children looking through the fence and decided to share some gum that he was carrying, it wasn't much though so he broke it up and gave it to as many as he could, it was still not enough. The children who didn't get any asked for the wrappers and smelled them.

Knowing that It was a long time since they had some, he decided to bring in candy for the children. Of course that wasn't allowed so he set about on a secret mission. Lieut. Gail went about collecting candy rations from fellow military crews and then made small parachutes from extra pieces of cloth and handkerchiefs. But how would they now that the plane was his? So one of the last things he told the kids there, that they could recognize his plane coming in by his wiggling his wings (thus giving him the nickname "Uncle Wiggiy Wings").

After his first drop the number of children started growing. The secret was out. Lieut. Halvorsen was called to the headquarters of Lieut. Gen. William Tunner who he feared would court-martial him, he didn't. Instead the General congratulated him and call this project" Operation Little Vittles". The C54 supply planes were given the name Candy Bombers! The word got back to the United States and many candy companies supplied their goods to help. More than 23 tons were dropped by 25 aircraft crews. Plenty of supplies, fuel, and candy made it to Berlin. The Russians finally dropped the blockade. <<<

2016 MAPS AIR ACADEMY

The 2016 edition of the MAPS Air Academy is now taking enrollments. Starting on Sunday, June 5th, the program will run for 10 consecutive Sunday. The program is designed for students ages 10 and up with a parent, grandparent or guardian.

The MAPS Air Academy, as originally designed by member John Sheridan, was designed to provide students with a learning opportunity like none that they will find in a traditional classroom. It combines science, technology, engineering and mathematical concepts with history, "real world" applications and access to the aircraft and equipment that made aviation history. This study of aviation and flying encompasses a majority of the curriculum that you traditionally find in schools and can be used to provide practical examples of a wide variety of subjects. Some examples of these connections are:

> How are they built? - Industrial Arts How do they fly? - Science Who made them fly? - History Where do they fly? - Geography Who controls them? - Government What do they cost? - Economics How to you plan a flight? - Mathematics Where do they land? - Social Studies

The subjects that will be introduced during the 10-week program include the following:

History of Flight Forces Affecting Flight Aircraft Controls and Surfaces Aircraft Instrumentation Aircraft Propulsion (Piston Engines and Propellers) Aircraft Propulsion (Turbines) Helicopters Helicopter Controls Air Traffic Control/Symbology Aircraft Pre-Flight Procedures Rocket Theory Rocket Launch Introduction to Radar Aviation Maps/Navigation Aviation Weather Flight Simulator Training Radar Flight Planning

The last week of the program is Collings' weekend. Air academy students will be able to take part in the festivities when the B-17 Flying Fortress, B-24 Liberator, B-25 Mitchell and P-51 Mustang are here at MAPS.
